### JMH TODAY

Last June a very good friend of the JMHAA retired from John Marshall. It was a great pleasure for us to know and work with Mr. Gilbert Freilino, Principal. He was a big supporter of our organization and will be missed. Gil, good luck, thanks, and best wishes.

This past January, Ross had the pleasure to meet the new Principal, Ms. Cynthia Metzger. She is the first female principal in the history of JMH. Ms. Metzger reported that she had heard great things about the JMHAA and is looking forward to working with us.

This year the student body consists of 1900 students. One of Ms. Metzger's goals is to bring back the Marching Band. The band was for years one of the best, if not the best, marching band in the Cleveland area. We need to return to this tradition!

Thanks to the passage of a school levy, JMH is slated to receive some much needed repairs. The third floor will be painted when school lets out. Carpeting in the media center and the wooden seats in the stadium are being replaced. The indoor pool is in the best shape ever! However, much work still needs to be done in the auditorium.

### SCHOOL

Finally! In June of 1997, the leaking, abandoned gas well, that was featured in the last Alumni News, was finally plugged. The well was 1200 feet below the 40 yard line. Principal Gilbert Freilino had said that until the fall of 1996 when the leak was discovered, no one was able to figure out why the grass would not grow in that area. Apparently pictures of the 1950's football games show the same bare spot on the gridiron. Work to cap the well took a short time and the football field was ready for use in the fall of 1997.

However, few games were played there, as other sites had been scheduled. The 1998 season should be back to normal.

### **STUDENTS**

Last year's newsletter reported on a group of students from JMH who participated in the "We the People" Competition and came away as State Champions after the competition in Columbus. Last April, the group of students headed to Washington, D.C. to represent the state of Ohio. Following is an excerpt of a letter we received from George Klepacz, Social Studies Department Chair and Faculty Advisor for the 'We the People' Competition.

We have returned from the national competition held in Washington, DC, April 26-28, 1997. We barely missed making the top ten high schools, but we were the best in region #3, the Central States. John Marshall received the highest two day total score of these eleven states. The Center for Civic Education does not list the final rankings in the competition, but we were somewhere between eleventh to fifteenth in the country based on the top ten and five regional winners. Although we were disappointed in not finishing higher, we did well in this competition against the twelve hundred students from the fifty other state championship teams.

My students learned that they can compete intellectually with the best in the nation. They also learned that they can conquer fear and that hard work can bring rewards. We had the opportunity to observe the top ten schools on the final day of the competition and the consensus among the students and myself was that we were very close to five of the schools and better than one of them. However, the top four schools, "would have blown us out of the water" as one of my students commented.

John Marshall will be back in the state competition again next year with a new group of students and will be seeking another state championship!

### SPORTS

Wrestling - Coach Gene Gibbons has had an exciting year. Last March, Coach Gibbons was named Coach of the Year. He is the state's leading wrestling coach with 298 victories and a charter member of the Ohio Wrestling Hall of Fame. Wrestling was revived in the Senate this past season, and in a league where wrestlers learn the sport from scratch, Marshall went undefeated in league matches, 11-5 overall, and won the 15th Senate Tournament.

In December, Gibbons earned dualmeet victory, number 300 in his 40th season as coach when the Lawyers beat Firestone in the Westlake Dual Meet Tournament.

Most recently, the team won its sixth straight title in the 16th Senate Tournament on February 20, 1998, at Lincoln West. The team had 219 1//2 points and seven champions.

Baseball - Last May, behind the 3 hit pitching of Kenny Aufmuth, the Lawyers defeated South, 6-1, in the annual Senate Championship Game Marshall (14-3) won its third consecutive city title and its fifth in Dennis Renk's 12 seasons as head coach.

Girl's Slow-Pitch Softball - Marshall, 15-2, headed to the Senate Championship at CSU to face the Lincoln-West Wolverines. The Lawyers defeated LW twice during the regular season, but lost this one 5-4.

Girl's Basketball Last year, the Lawyers were defeated, 61-48, by Collinwood in the 20th Senate Championship at South High.

In January 1998, In the final Senate game, the lady lawyers defeated JFK, 50-36. The Lawyers clinched its 3rd playoff spot in 4 years and will play East Tech, the winner advancing to city championship game.


